

DESSERT CONCERT

The Dessert Concert, held on April 16th in the gym, featured all the Walton orchestras plus the 8th grade Dodgen and Dickerson Orchestras. The evening was a perfect combination of music and desserts and gave us the chance to welcome the rising 9th graders and their families to Walton. The highlight of the evening was a composition of Coldplay's "Viva La Vida" arranged by Bennett Kane and Dr Holbrook. As always, the concert ended with The Russian Sailor Dance performed by over 230 musicians at warped speed! We especially thank Mary Frances Hamlin and Neera **Mathur** for chairing the event, and to Gay Stiltz for designing the program. WHY FUNDRAISING?

What parent or child would not want the benefits of a music education? Each student who participates in Walton orchestra is improving intellectual, motor, and social abilities and skills outside the realm of music, while improving success in their "regular" courses of study. Through their years in orchestra, students learn the value of sustained effort, of teamwork, and of reaching for and achieving at a level above the mediocre.

- Of all U.S. seniors taking the SATs, students in music programs scored 63 points higher on verbal and 44 points higher on the math, than did students with no arts participation.
- Music participants receive more academic honors and awards than non-music students, and their grades were much more likely to be higher.

- Data supports significant increases in self-esteem and thinking skills among participants in music programs.
- Secondary students who participated in band or orchestra reported the lowest lifetime and current use of all substances (alcohol, tobacco and drugs).
- Spatial reasoning skills, crucial to such functions as complex mathematics and science increase dramatically.
- The best engineers and technical designers in the Silicon Valley industry are, nearly without exception, practicing musicians. More music majors are accepted into medical school than are biology majors!

TUXEDO RETURN Tuesday, May 5th, 7:15–8:20 a.m.

Tuxedo return procedure:

- 1. Tuxes have to be **dry-cleaned**.
- 2. Tuxes must have the **name** of the student on the dry-cleaning bag.
- 3. If you want to have the same tux for next year, you must mark **reserved** on the tux.
- 4. You may NOT leave the tux in the orchestra room without officially checking it in with Mrs. Fulkerson.
- 5. Dropped off tuxes will be marked 'lost' and the student will be responsible for replacing it.
