
Why continue in orchestra?

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What's different at Walton and in Walton


Orchestra than Middle School?

- Opportunities to make friends with older students.
- In on-level orchestra, we don't do playing checks in front of the class (you do them on Flip).
- Cellos and Basses must have home instruments.
- We have a lot of random fun: Donut days. Panda Express Nights! Locker decorating contests. Pumpkin contests.
- Everyone in your class is on the same ability level.
- More input into music that you play
- More independence and more choices
- More freedom (7 minutes between classes!)
- The pace is faster---

Walton Registration

- You will complete the form the week of February 12th and your middle school teacher will enroll you in orchestra at Walton.
- If you want to be in the on-level, this is all you have to do.
- If you want to possibly be in a higher orchestra, you must audition.



Auditions

- Due by 4PM on Tuesday, March 19th on Flip
- Chamber Orchestra and Philharmonia only: you will have a theory assessment e-mailed to you to complete between March 15th and March 19th at 8AM.
- This is your only chance to audition.

Two Components of the Audition

- Scales (3 octave; optional 4th octave) QN = 60; slur 2 eighth notes; quarter note separate bow arpeggio
 - Violins: A Major, G Melodic Minor
 - Violas & Cellos: D Major, C Melodic Minor
 - Basses (2 octave; optional 3rd octave): G Major, G Melodic Minor
 - Scored on intonation and tone
- Excerpts
 - Sinfonia level
 - Philharmonia level: play Sinfonia level too
 - Chamber level: play Philharmonia and Sinfonia level too

Audition Registration

- You make the selection as you are registering for class.
- You must be recommended to audition for Chamber Orchestra.
- Please note Chamber has Monday night rehearsals from 6:30-8PM
